Report on the Audit of the Standalone Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the standalone financial statements of Getwell Clinic Charitable Society ("the Trust"), which comprise of the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2023 and the statement of Income and Expenditure for the year ended and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Trust as at March 31, 2023, and of its financial performance for the year then ended in accordance with the Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) issued by the ICAI. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. 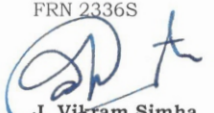

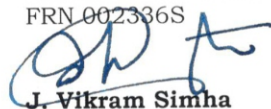
