OVERVIEW

Get Well Charitable Clinic or GWCC in short is proud to present its Annual Report for 2024-2025. In the past two years there has been significant rise in health care. We have been facing immense challenges from inflation in rising costs of medical supplies, equipment and man power wages. Nevertheless GWCC has been working hard, consistently in meeting deadlines, medical requirements and delivering timely health care in order to ensure people in the communities stay healthy.

Meeting Demand for Quality Care – In 2024-2025, GWCC's centers attended to more patients than previously i.e. increased visits for emergency services, primary care and dental care. It manages the Get Well Charitable Clinic, a non-profit medical centre based in the city of Hyderabad, State of Telangana, India. It was founded to provide affordable and accessible healthcare to under-served and low-income populations & communities. We operate on the principle that health is a fundamental right, not a privilege, and are dedicated to alleviating distress, disease, and deprivation among the most vulnerable populations. Get Well Clinic Charitable Society and Clinic is affiliated with Imamia Medics International (USA), working under its guidelines linking local efforts with international support.

The clinic operates both ongoing services and community such as Free Health Consultation Camps offering a range of services as follows:

- Dental Checkups,
- Eye and Cataract Screenings
- Diabetes Monitoring
- Orthopedic Consultations
- Specialized Cardiology camps with free ECG and 2D echo investigations.
- Blood donation drives
- Multi-speciality medical camps for underserved communities
- Collaborations with local hospitals and NGOs to extend reach in cardiology and eye camps.
- Free or subsidized medical services for underprivileged individuals.
- Health education and awareness programs focusing on first aid, disease prevention, and general health knowledge.
- Get Well Charitable Clinic offers a range of medical services, including general physicians, pathological lab, X-ray technicians, pediatric care, physiotherapy, dental, ENT and orthopedics' through its professional scheduled doctors.
- Since 2008 free services were provided to various charitable institutions in Hyderabad such as, Darul Yathama Orphanage, Zehra Boys Home Orphanage & Darulshifa Blind School & Hostel respectively

IMPACT & OUTREACH

- Get Well Clinic Charitable Society has expanded its operations by opening a second Clinic Branch in the State of Uttar Pradesh, Jalapur (India) in 2022.
- Subsequently the above new clinic regularly organizes free health camps, screening hundreds of patients for eye, cardiac, and general health conditions.
- The said clinic's efforts are supported by local and international donors, essential for sustaining its charitable work.
- Over the years, the clinic has become known for its effective and timely healthcare efforts, providing vital services to communities that might otherwise lack easy access to basic medical care.

EYE CAMPS 2024-2025

Get Well Charitable Clinic, in collaboration with Sadhram Eye Hospital, conducted several free eye camps during May, June, October, November, December 2024 and February 2025. The total patient screening and free cataract surgeries numbers you provided (**890 screenings and 125 surgeries**) are **approximate totals across multiple individual events** rather than a single large, continuous camp. The camps are held periodically, and individual reports indicate varying numbers of patients screened and those identified for free cataract surgery and subsequently are performed at Sadhram Eye Hospital.

The following is a summary of specific camps and their outcomes for the respective periods mentioned:

DATE/YEAR	SCREENING	CATARACT SURGERY
May 18, 2024	129 patients screened	12 identified for cataract surgery.
June 23, 2024	106 patients screened	11 identified for cataract surgery
October 20, 2024	193 patients screened	40 identified for cataract surgery.
November 17, 2024	147 patients screened	18 identified for cataract surgery
December 22, 2024	86 patients were screened	11 referred for cataract surgery
January 01, 2025	104 patients were screened	10 identified for cataract surgery
February 16, 2025	125 patients were screened	23 identified for cataract surgery.

In all cases, the surgeries, including transportation, accommodation, food, lenses, and post-operative care, were provided completely free of cost to the identified patients.

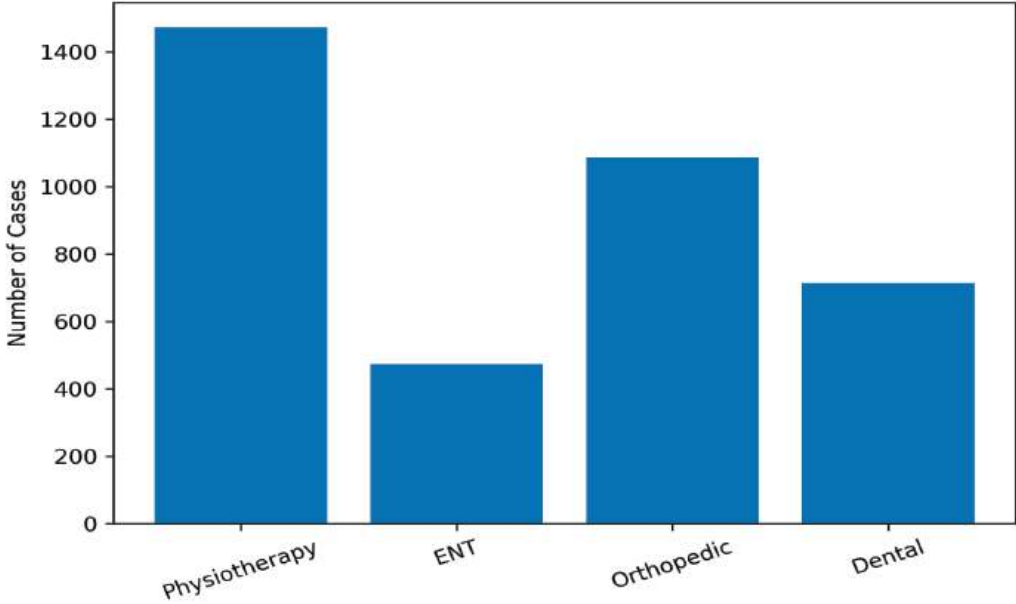

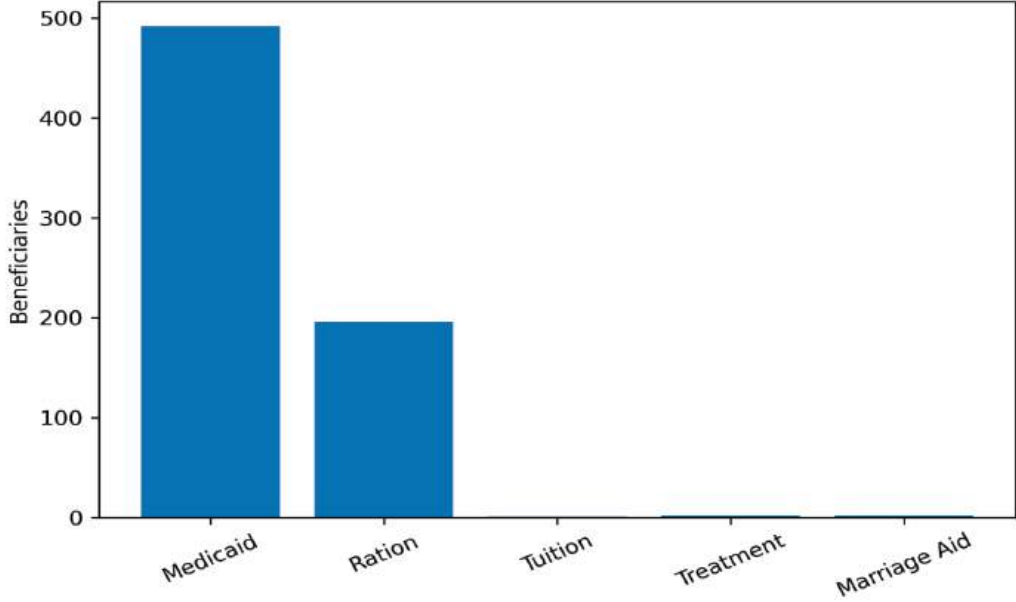




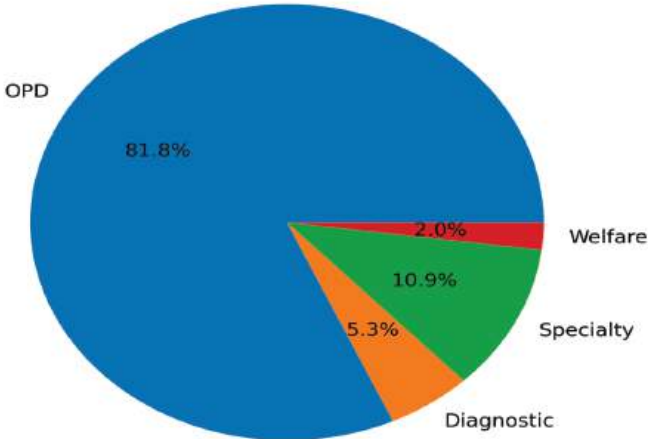

Opinion

We have audited the standalone financial statements of **Getwell Clinic Charitable Society ("the Trust")**, which comprise of the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2025 and the statement of Income and Expenditure for the year ended and a summary of the significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Trust as at March 31, 2025, and of its financial performance for the year then ended in accordance with the Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) issued by ICAI. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Trust in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by ICAI and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Trust's management is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Trust in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India. This responsibility includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Trust's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Trust or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Trust's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if,

individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal controls.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

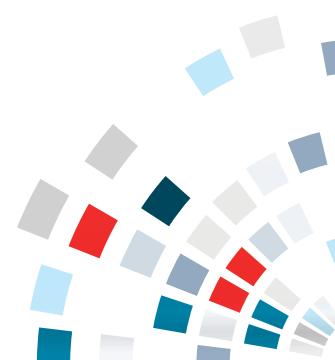
